By 4th Dan, applicants have demonstrated technical proficiency in the USJA curriculum. While kyu ranks through 3rd Dan focus on individual growth, promotion to 4th Dan and above is evaluated based on an applicant's service to the development of Judo through the USJA.

4th and 5th Dan ranks in the USJA are instructor grade ranks. For many local senseis, these will be terminal ranks.

6th, 7th, and 8th Dan ranks represent **extraordinary ranks** awarded for a mastery of the USJA curriculum and extraordinary service to the development of Judo through the USJA. Few will be honored with these ranks.

9th and 10th Dan ranks are the **highest honors awarded by the USJA**. These ranks are reserved for the best – individuals who have devoted a lifetime to the development of Judo through the USJA and have demonstrated unparalleled success on a national level.

The USJA recognizes that advanced ranks are not achieved through a mathematical formula, but through consideration of a multitude of efforts towards the growth of Judo within the USJA, including but not limited to an applicant's sustained service, leadership, and contributions. As such, the USJA Promotion Board is comprised of 6th Dan holders and above who are uniquely qualified to evaluate each submission holistically, with primary focus on service conducted since the applicant's most recent promotion. While it is understood that with age comes limitations, there are numerous ways to grow Judo - many of which are not physical - and promotions will not be awarded without active service.

Mandatory requirements for promotion include current USJA membership, completion of child abuse training, concussion training, and a satisfactory background check.

Applications for promotion should include a biographical listing of accomplishments in Judo throughout an applicant's career, with specific emphasis on service undertaken since the applicant's most recent promotion. Accomplishments achieved through the USJA will be given the most consideration.

Sample Categories that the Promotion Board will consider include, but are not limited to:

USJA LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Considered: Life Membership.

Strongly considered: Bronze, Silver, and Gold Life Membership

Most strongly considered: Patron Life Membership and above.

COMPETITION

Considered: Participating and/or placing in a local competition.

Strongly considered: Participating in a regional competition.

<u>Most strongly considered:</u> Participating and/or placing in a national competition.

COACHING

Considered:

- Head Coach/Assistant Head Coach of a chartered club.
- Coaching champions of local competitions.
- Teaching 100 hours of classes per year.

- Head Coach/Assistant Head Coach of a Class A/B club.
- Coaching champions of regional competitions.
- Teaching 200 hours of classes per year.
